


THE BARBARA WALKER CROSSING

The Barbara Walker Crossing is a 178-foot long pedestrian bridge that spans W Burnside St and connects the Wildwood Trail between Hoyt Arboretum and Pittock Mansion. The new bridge, designed by architect Ed Carpenter and completed in the fall of 2019, improves safety for trail users by eliminating a once dangerous road crossing. The bridge is named in honor of Barbara Walker, a Portland advocate for greenspace and trails, who helped to create local landmarks like the Tom McCall Waterfront Park, Pioneer Courthouse Square, and the Springwater Corridor, in addition to the “40-mile loop” that connects them all.

RECOMMENDED ROUTE

Hoyt Arboretum to Pittock Mansion (1.5-miles, one-way): Start your visit at Hoyt Arboretum’s Visitor Center. Follow the recommended route marked by the yellow squares through Hoyt’s Conifer Collection including a visit to the beautiful Redwood Deck. Continue north on the Wildwood Trail to the Barbara Walker Crossing and then to the Pittock Mansion grounds. Return to Hoyt Arboretum via the same route, or choose from several other Arboretum trails to return to your starting point.

At Hoyt Arboretum, look for the directional signs that match the trail colors found on the map.

WILDWOOD TRAIL

The Wildwood Trail extends 30 miles from its southern end at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Hoyt Arboretum to its northern end at NW Newberry Rd in Forest Park. In Washington Park, it connects the Archery Range, Portland Japanese Garden and International Rose Test Garden, as well as Arboretum highlights like the viewpoint of Mount St. Helens, the Winter Garden, and the Redwood Deck. The Wildwood Trail enters Forest Park when it crosses W Burnside St at the Barbara Walker Crossing and provides access to Pittock Mansion, the Portland Audubon Wildlife Sanctuary, and the Stone House (also known as the Witch’s Castle).



The Wildwood Trail in Hoyt Arboretum and Forest Park is marked every quarter-mile by diamonds stenciled on trees.

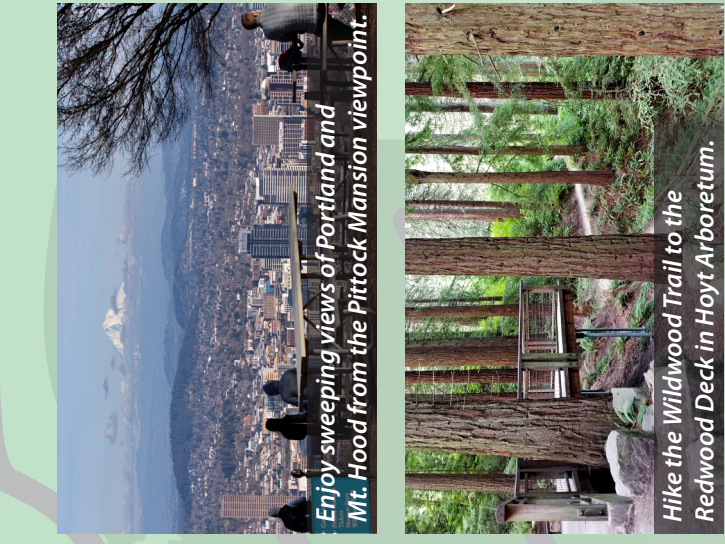

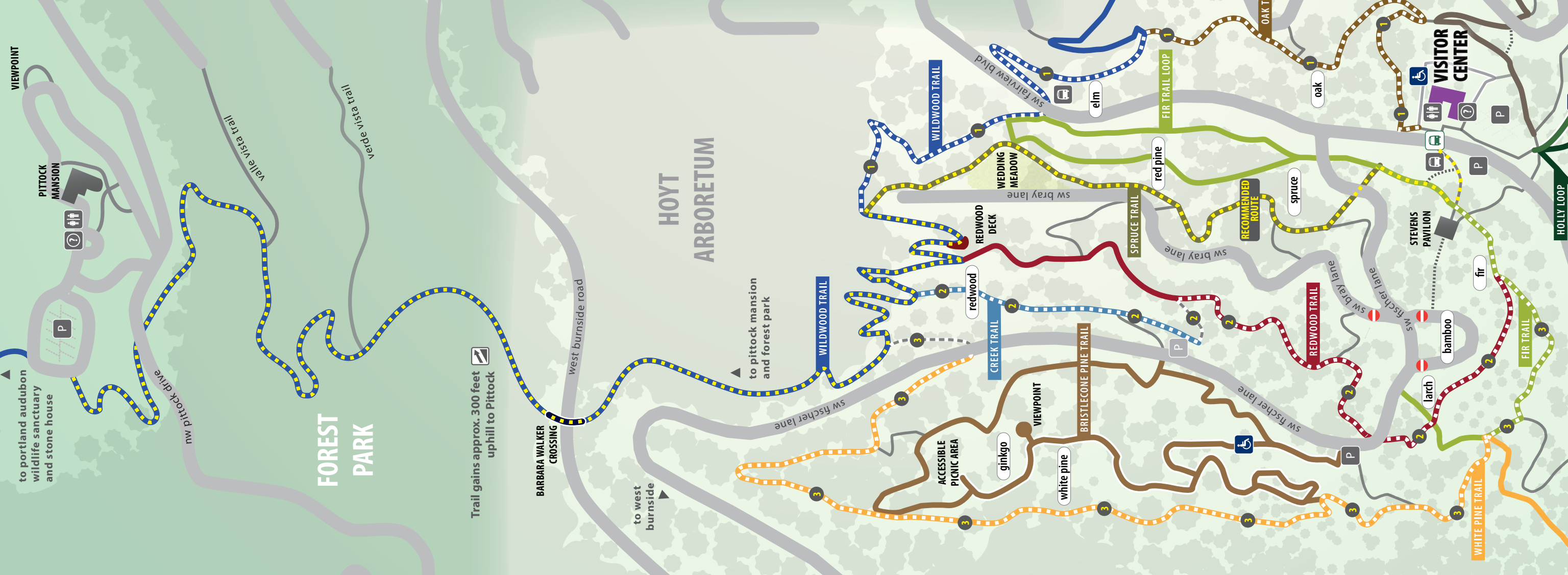
Wildwood Trail Map and Guide

Recommended Route:

Hoyt Arboretum to Pittock Mansion (1.5 miles one-way, approx. 40 minutes)
Fir/Spruce/Wildwood Trails

Alternate Return Routes through Hoyt Arboretum:

Explore more of Hoyt Arboretum by taking an alternate route on your return trip from Pittock Mansion! All options are approx. 3 miles round trip, 1 hour 20 minutes.

- 1 Option 1: Wildwood/Oak Trails
- 2 Option 2: Creek/Redwood/Fir Trails
- 3 Option 3: White Pine/Fir Trails

For an enjoyable visit and to make the Arboretum a safe place for all visitors, plants, and wildlife, please follow these guidelines:

- Bikes, scooters, and skateboards must remain on roads.
- Dogs must always be on leash; pet waste must be removed immediately.
- The Arboretum is smoke and tobacco free; alcohol at permitted events only.
- To protect Hoyt's trees, no tree climbing, hammocks, or slacklines.
- No foraging; leave plants, animals, and other natural features for all visitors to enjoy.
- No fires, camping, or drones.
